Morrison Hospital: is the principal training unit in Wales for maxillofacial surgeons and is the only designated centre in Wales for the treatment of children and adults with clefts of the lip and palate. Adrian has been training senior trainees in the specialty for more than 20 years and his team was the first to introduce both craniofacial implants and maxillofacial distraction osteogenesis into the UK.
